Comité Longueuil Villes sans racisme et discrimination

The committee, “Longueuil villes sans racisme et discrimination”, (CLV_sSRD) is launching a participatory study on the living conditions of *racialized* 1 persons in the agglomeration of Longueuil (Longueuil, Brossard, Saint Lambert, Saint Bruno and Boucherville).

This study will illustrate the living conditions before and during the pandemic based on the perspectives of the participants who will speak of their experiences concerning access to housing, employment, health, education, and with the police as well as any other aspect in their daily life.

Thanks to your collaboration, we will make your situation known and we will actively fight against the effects of racism and racist discrimination to improve general living conditions, particularly during this period of the pandemic.

We invite persons (born in Canada or outside Canada) from populations originating from Asia, Haiti, Africa, the Middle East, Latin-America, Syria, Iraq and Afghanistan, to participate and to express themselves.

To carry out this study, a focus group for each of the communities will be organized and will take place in the language of choice and /or the one shared by the group.

The meetings will take place during May and June, one evening per week or on Saturday mornings for approximately 2 hours via a ZOOM platform. We guarantee confidentiality and ensure that whatever is shared, will be compiled collectively and anonymously.

The committee is counting on your participation in this exploratory study and we thank you in advance. Together we will be stronger so that the voices of racialized persons in the agglomeration of Longueuil can be heard.
